Centaur: March is Out

Current design implementation underway, with feature article and event headlines with teasers on the cover page, similar to a magazine. The rest of the format will remain, with all the boilerplate kept in the same positions (calendar, officers, prez message, chapter reports, etc.). This will likely be tweaked as we go along.

e-Centaur Feb

Again, a slight redesign to accommodate content and give advertisers better visibility. April e-Centaur content is already underway.

Centaur Survey

Sent March 3 to ask members what topics they would like to see. Out of 174, 128 people like to hear about chapter news and events. 141 like clinic coverage, 106 equine health, 110 event coverage, 139 training tips and smaller numbers for several other categories: personal stories, national dressage news, breed articles, barn highlights, board member bios and instructor spotlights. Adult amateurs were the largest group responding. Largest showing group responding was those who do USDF/USEF recognized shows.

L Continuing Education

2017 L Graduate Continuing Education was a great success and realized a profit of \$154.92, plus we should receive a check from The Dressage Foundation for \$200 as well.

Per USDF these sessions may all be held indoors in a classroom setting. Given Colorado weather (and having frozen at several past events) I would recommend this for all future sessions! Walk-ins and auditors are likely to be greater if people know they will be comfortable.

I'd like to consider bringing an out of state instructor in for 2018. Only requirement from USDF is that they be an S judge. Depending on who I can engage, is there any interest in having a clinic with that person the day before and/or after the CE session? Again, given the time of year, we probably need a heated barn and easy access roads, with some on site stabling. It was suggested we get Melissa Creswick – great teacher. Beth suggested we talk to Lookout Ridge for a nice heated barn.

TD / Show Management training

We had four attendees for the TD continuing education. Joan Clay graciously proctored this session taught by Laurie McTavish as I was just out of surgery.

Heather Petersen taught the Show management portion. There were 7 attendees.


6. Marketing Una Schade

New Business:

Volunteer Medal Recognition Program

In 2009 NEDA created a program to recognize NEDA Volunteers. The program required volunteers to track their hours of service, then upon reaching a variety of benchmarks, volunteers would be awarded "medals" (pins).

The pins cost \$12 and were made by Lovell Designs. 390 pins were ordered in June 2009 at a total cost of \$4600.

Bronze Medal 300 hours lowered to 100 hours (January 2017)
Silver Medal 600 hours lowered to 250 hours (January 2017)
Gold Medal 1,000 hours lowered to 500 hours (January 2017)

As of the close of 2016, the following people have been awarded Volunteer Medals < insert list of who has been awarded medals >

Because the program hasn't been properly publicized, and many of our volunteers have NOT taken the time to track and report their hours, the Membership Committee made the following recommendations to the board, which were approved at the January 2017 meeting.

- 1. Create a list of people who have already been awarded medals.
- 2. Assign all volunteers an identification number in the YM database (if volunteers are or have been members, their ID will be their membership number).
- 3. Create a process to collect volunteer names and hours from event managers throughout each calendar year, and record that information in YM.
- 4. Lower the hour requirements for each medal (see above).
- 5. Issue a certificate, annually, to each volunteer, thanking them for their number of hours. This certificate will serve as an annual reporting of hours to both the volunteer and the board.
- 6. Once a volunteer has received a Bronze, Silver and Gold Medal, their total hours will be reset to zero, and they can begin the recognition process again, achieving the status of "Double Bronze," "Double Silver," etc.
- 7. Board Members will be awarded medals based on years of service (number of years still to be determined).
- 8. Board Members who volunteer outside their board role may track and report their non-board hours for inclusion toward the hour requirements for medals.
- 9. As the program continues to take shape, the following things should be considered:
- a. Where should medals be awarded? At the Year End Awards Banquet and/or the next event a recipient is volunteering at?
- b. Recipients should be recognized in the Tip.
- c. Past and present recipients should be listed in The Salute and on the NEDA website.

Gwen would like to appointment a committee to develop something. Beth Geier will chair the committee and Sharon Soos will help her.
